

Stranraer and District Angling Association

This is the data protection policy of Stranraer and District Angling Association. It complies with the following privacy principals with respect to personal data.

Its purpose is to comply with the General Data Protection Regulation (2016), the Data Protection Act (2018), the common law duty of confidentiality and all other UK national legislation.

- 1. The Association has access to lawfully acquired personal data and it processes that data in an open and transparent manner**
- 2. The policy provides protection to any kind of data it collects with the consent of the data holders, including names, addresses – both postal and email and more. All data that is gathered is with the consent of members and visitors to enable the Association to fulfil its services to anglers.**
- 3. The Association will process the data only if and to the extent that;**
 - It has gained the consent of the data holders**
 - The processing is necessary for the relationship of the parties**
 - The processing is necessary for compliance with any legal obligations**
 - The processing is to further legitimate Association interests**
 - It is necessary for the Association's performance**
- 4. The Association collects information with the explicit consent of the data holders and it uses it for the explicit, legitimate purposes set forth in this policy and for no other purpose.**
- 5. The Association only collects data that is adequate, relevant and limited for the purposes for which it is being collected – that being accessing the Association's waters for the purpose of angling and related activities.**
- 6. The Association collects data as accurately as possible.**
- 7. The Association takes every measure reasonable and necessary to maintain the integrity and confidentiality of the information being collected. It does not allow unauthorised access to the data.**

- 8. Data that is necessary to run the Association and from which it generates revenues and is collected with free consent and for a legitimate purpose will remain Association property. The association will have the ultimate power to use that data legitimately.**
- 9. Personal data will be retained by the Association as long as necessary. It shall be deleted immediately after the need is over. Personal data may be disclosed to the Association's Committee.**
- 10. Personal data may be disclosed to third parties as required by UK law.**
- 11. The data holder has the right to ask for any data from the Association except that which is adverse to the Association's interests.**
- 12. In the case of a breach of data the Association will inform the individual(s) concerned and the appropriate authority within 48 hours of the breach.**
